

Plan de Competitividad Turística

A natural corridor between The Vegas of Antequera and Granada, historically a route between the Guadalquivir region and the steppes and mountains area of Andalucia. The northeastern region of Málaga is located in a central position, in a crossroad of routes and cultures.

We can divide this territory into three very differentiated zones: the northern zone formed by the villages of Cuevas Bajas, Cuevas de San Marcos, Villanueva de Tapia and Villanueva de Algaidas; Archidona situated in the centre of the region; and Villanueva del Rosario and Villanueva del Trabuco, located in the southern zone where the landscape has great importance with a chain of mountains that cross the province of Málaga.
